Jackie Gagnon has been a fitness guru for 20 years.

Today, she's ready to put that experience to work at Fit for Life, located in the former Curves location in Hayesville at 321 Hwy 64 West.

"We have a circuit of hydraulic machines, cardio equipment and we offer various exercise classes," she said. "We have Pilates, toning, cardio and Zumba classes. We also have 10 percent off on our memberships during January. The memberships include everything offered at the fitness center."

Gagnon has always taken pride in staying fit.

"I have been in fitness for 20 years," she said. "I have been teaching at many of the local facilities for the past eight years. When Curves (in Hiawassee and Hayesville) closed this seemed like the perfect time to start out on my own."

"These are winter hours and we will be opened more in the warmer weather months," she said.

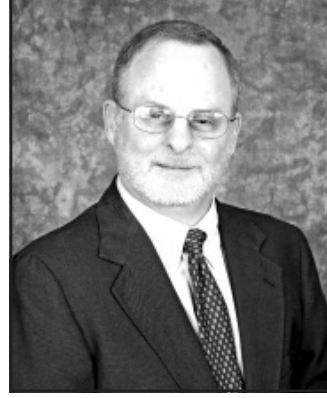
Membership rates run \$6 per day, or \$25 per week. A one month membership is \$40; three months, \$115; six months for \$210 or one year for \$330.

"These are paid-in-full rates," she said. "A monthly Automatic draft is available at \$32 per month. The 10 percent discount doesn't apply to the \$32 rate."

Also, exercise classes are available. The rates run \$6 for a one day class; punch cards are available for 10 classes at \$50. Also, gift cards for five classes are available for \$27.50.

Crane Creek Vineyards takes gold

Each year The San Francisco Chronicle sponsors an American wine competition. This year over 4,900 wines were entered into competition by class or category and were judged by a prestigious panel of 60 experts. Crane Creek Vineyards 'took the gold' in the Native American red category (480 wines submitted) for its 2007 Hellbender Red, made from the Norton grape. In the dry rose' category, a Bronze medal was awarded to Crane Creek Vineyards for its 2008 Villard Noir.

Upon being notified as a medal winner, Eric Seifarth, owner and wine master, stated "It is certainly an honor for our vineyard to receive these medals, especially in such a large national competition. It is exciting to see our wines recognized for their quality and taste." When asked to explain the Hellbender Red name, he stated it is a combination of two native reds. A Hellbender is the largest red salamander in the Western hemisphere and is found in the upper elevation streams of Towns County. The grape, Norton, can be traced back to Virginia in the late 1700's.
