took a 6-0 lead.

After the kickoff, the Bulldogs made the first of a sack full of interceptions and moved to the 18yard line. After a tackle by Matt Beni, the Dogs bobbled the pigskin again and the Indians grabbed it at the 5-yard line. After changing ends of the field the Tribe stalled out and were forced to kick.

The worst shank punt of the season traveled 18 yards and the Bulldogs were in prime real estate again. But wait! The officials called the play a safety due to a penalty call in the end zone awarded the Dogs 2 points and the Indians had to kick off, now trailing 8-0.

The Dogs returned the free kick back to the 50-yard line. They failed to move the ball and the Indians took over but quickly relinquished the ball on another interception.

Austin Bradley crashed the backfield for a solo tackle and a follow-up sack put the Dogs deep in their own territory. But wait! A roughing the passer penalty gave the Dogs a first down instead of the

Matt Beni picked off a Dog pass and returned it to the 50-yard line but a botched pitchout backed the Indians to the 30-yard line. John Swilley then loaded his gun and rifled a pass completion to Billy Meier at the 7-yard line. Again the Red Zone play proved futile and the Dogs took over on downs.

A screen pass was headed for the end zone but a solo tackle by Mat Hogsed at the 5-yard line

saved the score. After two tries, the Dogs pushed a 1-yard touchdown across with four seconds left on the halftime clock and another Indian flag was assessed on the ensuing kickoff.

At the half the score was 15-0. As play resumed in the third quarter and muddled around at mid-field, the Dogs made their third pick of the night at the 19yard line. After a Dog pass completion and another Indian penalty for a late hit, the visitors still failed to convert and the ball reverted to the Indians.

The Dogs then got the ball back on their fourth interception of the game at the 28-yard line. Mat Hogsed made another TD saving solo tackle in the fourth quarter to keep the game at 15-0. Devin Henderson scooped up another Bulldog fumble to thwart their drive at the 36-yard line.

After their fifth pick in the game, the Bulldogs won the battle of interceptions and the Tribe won the battle of fumble recoveries. Joseph Foster, Landon Harris and Billy Meier joined forces to stop the Dog drive, then a Mat Hogsed catch moved the Tribe to the 14yard line but a fourth down quarterback sneak after a bobbled snap came up six inches short and the Dogs took over at the 2-yard line. After a first down and unsportsmanlike conduct penalty, the Dogs were back at mid-field. The clock ran out in the game with the Bulldogs taking a 15-0 win on homecoming night at the stadium.

YHC will field varsity basketball teams beginning with the 2010-11 season.

Herrmann and Paul put the tryout participants through a rigorous workout that lasted nearly two hours. The coaches led the players through shooting, passing, ball handling and defensive drills, and a short scrimmage rounded out the evening.

There was a solid attendance at the event, with spectators filling the bleachers and spilling over onto the floor. The coaches were thrilled with the number of prospective players who turned out, too.

"This is a much larger group of women here than I thought would turn out," Paul said. "This is just tremendous. I've coached at the Division I and Division II levels and have had many tryouts like this, and I've never had this many players come out."

Following the workout, Herrmann and Paul invited all the participants and spectators to the middle of the floor to thank them for their desire to help build the program. At the end of the event, everyone in the gym raised their hands in a single huddle and shouted, "Team!" The coaches stressed the im-

portance of student participation in the program, telling them that there is a place for everyone with the team.

"We need you to be involved with this basketball program," Herrmann said. "Whether it's as a student manager, an office assistant or an athletic trainer; maybe you have an interest in coaching and would like to be a student assistant; or as a fan cheering for your team, we need you.

"Students are what this program is all about," he continued. "I was asked what day of the week I wanted to start the season on next year, and I asked, 'What day will allow the most students to attend the game?' So, we're looking at opening on a Thursday night. How
