## Artists duo to present free concert at YHC

Young Harris College's Division of Fine Arts presents "Baroque Life, Love and Heartache," a concert featuring guest artist Missie Kirkland, soprano, and Cynthia DeFoor, harpsichord, Young Harris College staff accompanist and adjunct instructor of music, Tuesday, Oct. 27. The free concert begins at 7 p.m. in Susan B. Harris Chapel on the Young Harris College campus and is open to the public. For more information, contact the Division of Fine Arts at (706) 379-5182.

The program features a variety of music from the Baroque period, including works by Henry Purcell and George Frideric Handel. Kirkland and DeFoor performed the program in recital on June 25, 2009.to a sold-out house at The Handel House Museum in London,

England, as part of the Museum's concert series.

Kirkland attended Columbus State University. Her opera roles include Sally in Barber's "A Hand of Bridge," Zita in Puccini's "Gianni Schicci," Dorabella in Mozart's "Cosi Fan Tutte," and Marcellina in Mozart's "Le Nozze di Figaro." She has also performed for renowned vocalists and opera coaches such as Laura Brooks-Rice, Jay Lessenger, Beverly Wolf, William Fred Scott and Carol Webber.

Kirkland has been the soprano soloist in Faure's "Requiem," Mendelssohn's "Elijah,"

Mozart's "Regina Coeli," Saint-Saens' "Christmas Oratorio," Handel's "Messiah," Holst's "Christmas Day" and Vivaldi's "Gloria." She has also performed in numerous recital venues, most recently

with DeFoor at the Handel House in London.

Kirkland is currently the student of Dr. Sandy Calloway and was a student of the late Dr. Jonathan Bartlett. She is a member and soprano soloist with the Mountain Community Chorus and Chamber

Singers as well as the St. Clare's Episcopal Church Choir.

DeFoor was appointed staff accompanist at Young Harris College in 1998 and adjunct instructor of music in 2000. She received a bachelor of music degree in piano pedagogy from Shorter College, where she studied piano with Elizabeth Buday. She has studied organ with Peter DeWitt and Jan van Otterloo.

DeFoor has been an independent music teacher for 24 years in Florida and Georgia. She has extensive accompanying and collaborative music experience in both chamber and orchestral settings. She is a member of Music Teachers National Association, Georgia Music Teachers Association, Northeast

Georgia Music Teachers Association and the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International.

In addition to her academic role at Young Harris College, DeFoor serves as the organist/choirmaster at St. Clare's Episcopal Church in Blairsville, Ga.

DeFoor will perform on the Jeffrey Richard Moylan Zuckermann Flemish Double Harpsichord presented to Young Harris College by Ralph Tilden of Banner Elk, N.C.
