Lady Indians X-Country returns to state championships

The Towns County Lady Indians' Cross Country team is returning to the state championships in Carrollton as the No. 3 seed out of Region 8-A.

Coach Jenny Ledford-Stephens' boy's squad came up just short of a trip to Carrollton, finishing fifth. Only the top four teams out of region head to state.

"They've battled illness, our top two runners were so sick, but they ran as hard as they ever do," she said. "They worked so hard to get here, but they finished just short. I'm so proud of them, I don't know what to say."

"If they're healthy, they're there," she said.

The Lady Indians finished ninth in the state last year, and proved to be the only public school in the Top 10 finishers.

"I graduated a lot of kids last year," she said. "It takes a special person to be a cross country runner. It's not something someone is going to do unless they have that special gift in their bodies. It's the toughest thing you will ever learn to love."

Coach Ledford-Stephens is realistic in her hopes for this year's event. She believes her ladies can finish in the Top 20 teams, "hopefully Top 15," she said. "It's a different race this year over last year."

"The two girls (Amy Vardeman and Melissa Conrad) that I have as seniors have now done a complete set from 9 through 12 going to state," Coach Ledford-Stephens said.

"We're absolutely nervous, we're battling to stay healthy," she said. "We've had a lot of injuries and we're still trying to make sure that we stay healthy and not get the flu. I only have


six girls; my seventh had a knee injury that put her out for the rest of the season.

"Three of those six are now starting basketball, Amy is dancing and Cassie Buck and Kristin Fuhs are literally the only ones that I have that aren't doing double duty," Coach Ledford-Stephens said. "They work very hard, they really do."

The future is bright for the Lady Indians as Ansley Vardeman, her twin Taylor Vardeman and Caitlin Sheffield are rising through the ranks.

Ansley Vardeman ran away from a field of older runners in the JV race at the Region Championships. Her sister Taylor finished third on the heels of a runner from Lakeview Academy.

Young Harris College women's soccer coach Kathy Brown has been named National Junior College Athletic Association Region XVII Coach of the Year in a vote by the region's coaches, while six Young Harris players earned either first or second team All-Region honors.

Brown led the Mountain Lions to an 8-6-1 overall record while coaching a team made up completely of freshmen and sophomores into several matches against NCAA Division II or NAIA opponents that feature more experienced juniors and seniors. Of the six losses, all came at the hands of teams that were either NCAA Division II members or ranked ahead of Young Harris in the NJCAA national poll.

Of the six Mountain Lions to earn All-Region honors, Emily Villas, Rachel Wilkes and Lauren Martin all earned first-team honors, while

Kelsey Cunningham, Jolie Kahn-Foss and Mica Lopes were all named to the second team.



Indian softballers receive accolades




