GDOT to hold April 6 meeting on four-lane expansion

The Georgia Department of Transportation is aiming for the year 2020 to start construction on a project to widen Georgia 515/US 76 to four lanes between Blairsville and Young Harris, according to GDOT documents.

GDOT officials will hold a "Location and Design Public Hearing Open House" at the Towns County Recreation and Conference Center in Young Harris on Thursday, April 6, from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. The Rec Center is located at 150 Foster Park Rd. in Young Harris.

Residents are invited to attend the open house to view the current plans and leave comments that could potentially affect the outcome of the project.

Hiawassee man dies in Blairsville car crash

BLAIRSVILLE-A28year-old Hiawassee man died Saturday as a result of injuries sustained during a one-vehicle accident on Georgia 515 in Union County, according to the Georgia State Patrol.

Trooper First Class Joshua Hedden was dispatched at approximately 11 a.m. on March 25 to a reported crash on GA 515 near BW Ranch Road, TFC Hedden said.

"The driver of the vehicle, a 2002 Chevrolet Suburban, was traveling west on SR 515," Hedden said. "The driver, Mr. James Drow, for an unknown reason, traveled into the left westbound lane of SR 515. Mr. Drow overcorrected his steering in an attempt


Van Vliet gives talk on economic development study


