Football: Missed tackles sink Indians in 35-0 loss to Johnson

The Towns county Indians played hard last Friday night, Oct. 13, but came up short vs. Johnson-Gainesville,

losing 35-0.
"Missed tackles really hurt us on defense," shared head coach Jason Roquemore. "We had 25 missed tackles."

In passing, Johnson hit 5 of 6 for 56 yards alongside their 28 carries for 177 yards in rushing, putting them at 233 yards total. In comparison, Towns connected on 2 of 8 for 28 yards in passing and 24 carries for 164 yards in rushing, adding up to 192 total yards.

As far as turnovers, Johnson protected the football all night, whereas Towns had both a fumble and a bad snap for a

"If you look at the stats, we played well," Roquemore said. "The biggest difference [between Towns and Johnson] was that they were able to convert the third downs in the red zone and we couldn't. We had several opportunities to make a play on third down, and for whatever reason, we just had a hard time converting those."

In total on third down, Towns converted 2 for 7 vs. Johnson's 2 of 4.

While the score favored Johnson, the game didn't go completely smoothly for them, with Johnson facing 5 penalties for 65 yards. In comparison to Towns' 8 for 55, however, things still looked up for John-

"We know we've got a tough stretch ahead," said Roquemore. "These last three (games) are going to be very tough for us to match up. Each week I felt like our kids have done a good job trying to execute what we're putting in, we've just been overwhelmed sometimes and overmatched.
