such carts, simply wait by the front gate when entering the light show.

“Mountain Country Christmas in Lights” will be open every Thursday through Sunday, 6 p.m. until 10 p.m., from now until New Year’s Day. Tickets for the show are

\$5 per person, or \$4 per person for groups of 15 people or more, and all children under 12 years of age get in for free.
