Brad Keselowski won the 2012 Sprint Cup championship.

selowski's struggles in 2013 were entirely his fault. The team switched from Dodge to Ford, and was further hampered by Ford's continued issues with the lack of

Keselowski had driver points taken away when it was discovered that Penske was using unapproved suspension pieces, and his crew chief and lead engineer were suspended for a couple of weeks. "Some weeks last year

we were pretty good," Keselowski continued. "We run well. We were fast. Sometimes we were probably a third to fifth to sixth place car. 
