Towns County men's soccer take down Union for first time ever

Ladies tie Union, shutout Rabun before Providence hands Lady Indians' first loss


The Towns County Indians (1-4, 0-2) took a 1-0 lead over Union County last Tuesday night and made the lead stick in a historic victory over the rival Panthers.

The win is the Indians first over Union County since the soccer program took hold in the early 2000s. In fact, in the 11 prior meetings before last Tuesday, Union had outscored the Indians 69-5, including a pair of shutouts

The Indians win came on the heels of one of Union's most successful seasons in team history. Last year the Panthers advanced the Class AA Sweet 16 after defeating Chattahoochee High School 10-0 in the first round of the Class AA State Tournament.

This year, Union battled injuries early and had started to come together, winning three-in-a-row, including a victory over 8-AA opponent Washington-Wilkes before the Indians handed them just their second shutout of the year.

Will de Vries and Kobe Denton recorded the Indians only two hits of the contest and Harrison Hobbs recorded an


