Indians still looking for first win

Blue Ridge, NC - The Towns County Indians Varsity Basketball Team struck for a 4-0 lead on field goals by Boone Moss and Slade Davenport in less than two minutes at the start of their game at Blue Ridge High School in Cashiers last Tuesday but fell victim to an astounding shooting spree the remainder of the quarter.

The home standing Bobcats struck for six treys and an old fashioned three point play in using a 23-6 run the final 5:25 of the first quarter for a 23-10 lead after one quarter.

Baskets by Major Moss got the Indians a 6-6 tie and to within 11-8 during the Blue Ridge run but a 12-2 finish within the overall run by the Bobcats built the big lead the Indians would challenge but never overcome in eventually falling by a 58-42 score.

The Indians turned the tables on the Bobcats in the second quarter with Boone Moss pouring in twelve points as they went on a 13-5 run for just a 28-23 deficit by the 1:19 point. But the Bobcats sank two free throws and a deuce the final minute to regain some momentum with a 32-23 lead at intermission.

Trace Moss matched an early Bobcat trey and deuces by Adam Barrett and Trace Moss likewise matched two-pointers by the Bobcats with the Indians still within single digits at 39-30 past the mid point of the third quarter but the Bobcats finished on a modest 5-1 run good enough for a 44-31 lead entering the fourth quarter.

The Bobcats then opened the fourth quarter with a 12-3 run for their biggest lead of 56-34 by the 2:54 mark with the Indians then reducing the lead on two field goals by Trace Moss, one by Barrett, and one by Major Moss the final 2:40 as Blue Ridge took the 58-42 victory.

Scoring leaders for the game for the Indians were Boone Moss with 15 points, Trace Moss with 9, and Davenport and Major Moss with 6 each while Trace Moss and
